Combat medic or field medic is a US term for military personnel who have been trained to at least an EMT-B level (16-week course in the U.S. Army), and are responsible for providing first aid and frontline trauma care on the battlefield. They are also responsible for providing continuous medical care in the absence of a readily available physician, including care for disease and battle injuries. 68W (often pronounced as sixty-eight whiskey using the NATO phonetic alphabet) is the Military Occupational Specialty (MOS) for the United States Army's Combat Medic Specialist (Combat Medic). This specialty is open to males and females as well as allowing color vision deficient personnel. Leaders must be located where they can best command and control the convoy or their portion of it. Generally, a leader should be centrally located in the unit within the order of march, but may need to maneuver to get to a vantage point that will allow him visibility of the battlefield when required.
